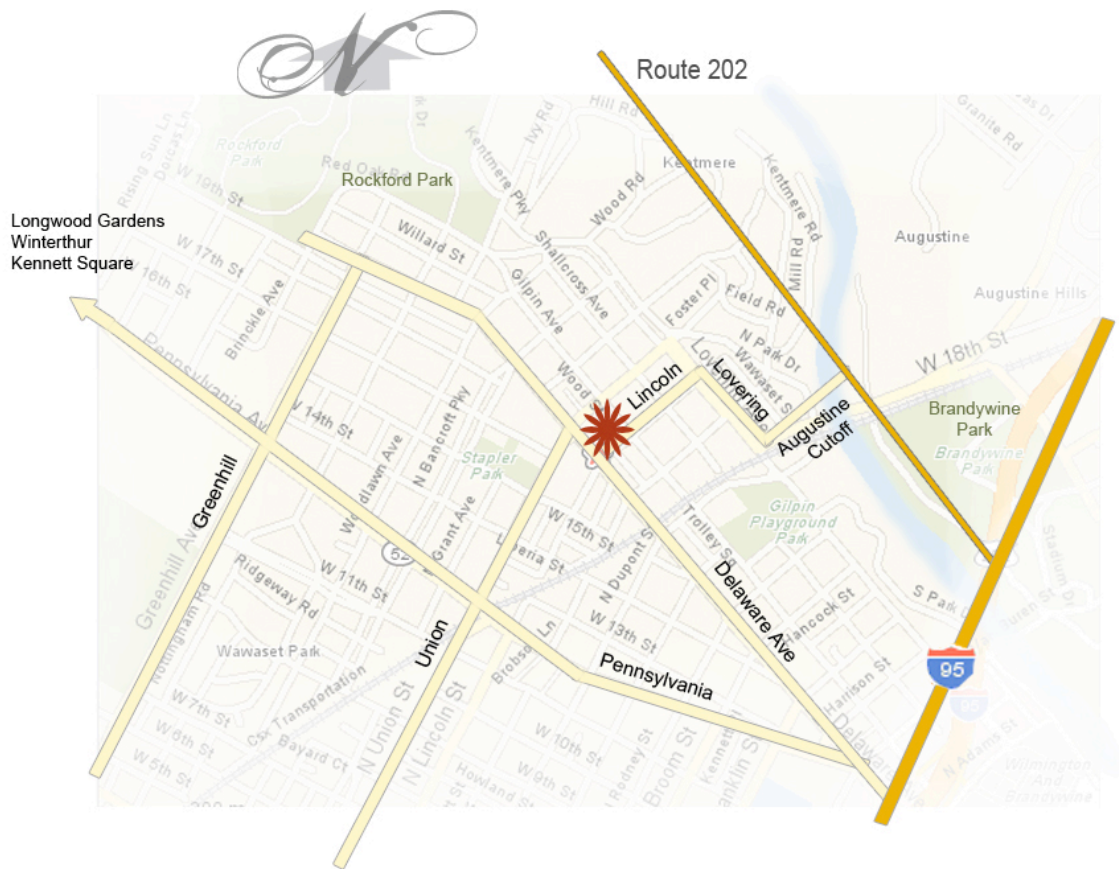

I-95 driving from the North; Philadelphia, NYC, NJ via Commodore Barry Bridge:

1. Take 95 South into Delaware, after you go over the bridge entering Wilmington (with the pretty lamp-posts on either side)
2. Take exit 7B – towards 52 North/Delaware Avenue
3. Go through one stop sign, and at the light at the end of the off ramp make a right on to Delaware Avenue. The Delaware Children's theatre will be in front of you.
4. Go through one light, and stay to the right on Delaware Avenue; following signs towards Trolley Square
5. Continue through six lights and continue on Delaware Avenue, past the Trolley Square shopping center on your right, Kelly's Logan House and under the Trolley Square train tracks.

6. When you see Scott Street on your right, park anywhere on Delaware Avenue you see a spot (please keep an eye out for street cleaning days & times). We are at 1825 Delaware Avenue, three shops from the corner of Lincoln and Delaware Streets.

I-95 driving from the South; Baltimore, DC, and Southern Delaware:

1. Take 95 North into Wilmington, Delaware to exit 7; Delaware Avenue/Route 52
2. At your third light, take a left onto Delaware Avenue/52 North. There will be a large church on your right as you turn left.
3. Go through two lights, and stay to the right on Delaware Avenue; following signs towards Trolley Square
4. Continue through six lights and continue on Delaware Avenue, past the Trolley Square shopping center on your right, Kelly's Logan House and under the Trolley Square train tracks.
5. After you see Scott Street on your right, park anywhere on Delaware Avenue you see a spot (please keep an eye out for street cleaning days & times). We are at 1825 Delaware Avenue, three shops from the corner of Lincoln and Delaware Streets.

Route 202 driving from the North: West Chester, Lancaster, Pottstown:

1. Travel on Route 202 South towards Wilmington/I-95. Go past the Concord Mall, AstraZeneca and Independence Plaza (on your left).
2. After passing the Independence Plaza, stay to your right and take a right onto Augustine Cutoff just before the exits for I-95.
3. Travel on Augustine Cutoff through several lights until it ends at Lovering Avenue. Take a right onto Lovering.
4. Go through one stop sign, and at the second stop sign take a left onto North Lincoln Street.
5. Travel three blocks on Lincoln until you reach the corners of Lincoln and Delaware. Park on Lincoln street if you see a space, if not turn onto Delaware and look for a parking spot there (please keep an eye out for street cleaning days & times). We are at 1825 Delaware Avenue, three shops from the corner of Lincoln and Delaware Streets.

From NYC/DC via Amtrak

1. Take the train to the Wilmington station
2. Upon exiting the station, you will see a taxi stand out front
3. Direct the taxi driver to 1825 Delaware Avenue. It is about a five-minute cab ride from the Wilmington train station to Laura Novak Photography.

A few notes about meeting with us:
